








Three days and three nights

Matthew 12:38 – 40

³⁸ Then some of the Pharisees and teachers of the law said to him, "Teacher, we want to see a sign from you."

³⁹ He answered, "A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a sign! But none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah.

⁴⁰ For as Jonah was **three days and three nights** in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be **three days and three nights in the heart of the earth**.



Jesus buried just before Sunset (when evening had come) – Sabbath just about to start

```
Friday night - ½ a day
Saturday – 1 day

Sabbath
```

Sunday morning – ½ day – women can very early – (Mt28:1, Mk 16:2, Lk 24:1 Jn 20:1)

Total 2 days!

```
Some say – Friday = day 1
Saturday = day 2
Sunday = day 3
```

Jesus said 3 days and 3 nights!

The biblical principle of the day

Genesis 1

- ¹In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.
- ²The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.
- ³Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness

⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day.

The biblical principle of the day

Genesis 1

⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the **evening and the morning** were the first day.


⁸ And God called the firmament Heaven. So the **evening and the morning** were the second day.

¹³ So the evening and the morning were the third day.


¹⁹ So the **evening and the morning** were the fourth day.

Three Days and Three Nights Definition of a day

Midday – time when the sun casts the shortest shadow



"gnomon" is from an ancient Greek root meaning "to know."



John 2:18 - 19

- ¹⁸ So the Jews answered and said to Him, "What sign do You show to us, since You do these things?"
- ¹⁹ Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days (after three days) I will raise it up."

Mark 8:31 (Luke 9:22)

³¹ And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again.

Luke 24:46

Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day (after the third day)


John 19: 31

³¹ Therefore, because it was the **Preparation Day**, that the bodies should not remain on the cross **on the Sabbath** (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

Leviticus 23


- ⁴ 'These are the feasts of the LORD, holy convocations which you shall proclaim at their appointed times.
- ⁵ On the fourteenth day of the first month (Nisan) at twilight is the LORD's Passover.
- ⁶ And on the **fifteenth day** of the same month is the **Feast of Unleavened Bread** to the LORD; seven days you must eat unleavened bread.
- ⁷On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work on it. ⁸ But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD for seven days. The seventh day shall be a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work on it.' "



¹¹ He shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted on your behalf; on the day after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it. ¹² And you shall offer on that day, when you wave the sheaf, a male lamb of the first year, without blemish, as a burnt offering to the LORD.

1 Corinthians 15

²⁰ But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. ²³ But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those who are Christ's at His coming.


Summary
